REGULATORY OPERATIONS STAFF'S COMMENTS

The Regulatory Operations Staff ("Staff") of the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada ("Commission") submits these Comments pursuant to Procedural Order No. 3 ("PO 3"). PO 3 requested Comments on a Pilot Plan ("Pilot") project to develop solutions for tracking and certifying Nevada portfolio energy credits ("PECs"). Staff's responses are below.

I. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Commission opened this Docket on September 26, 2018, "[t]o determine whether providers of electric service should be authorized to utilize alternative solutions, including, but not limited to, blockchain-based solutions, to track and certify Nevada portfolio energy credits." *Investigation & Rulemaking to Examine Current Regulations Governing Nevada's Renewable Portfolio Standard*, Docket No. 18-09008, 2019 WL 1367646, at *1 (Nev. P.U.C. Mar. 20, 2019). Comments were filed on April 15, 2019, and a Workshop occurred on May 6, 2019. NV Energy ("NVE"), Energy Web Foundation, and Blockchains, LLC filed a letter on September 20, 2019. The letter described a PEC pilot project, and potential next steps for this Docket. On June 4, 2020, the Commission issued Procedural Order No. 2.

Staff filed Comments on July 15, 2020, identifying several overarching principles for this Docket and proposing next steps. Staff's Comments, 1:24-28 – 3:1-16 (filed on July 15, 2020, in PUCN Docket No. 18-09008). Staff noted that the Commission should ensure that any alternative to track and certify PECs is not a solution in search of a problem. *Id.* at 3:8-9. If the Commission is going to devote resources to investigating, researching, reviewing, and potentially authorizing the use of an alternative solution to

tracking and certifying PECs, then there should be a showing that the benefits to be gained will more than marginally outweigh the costs. *Id.* at 3:10-13. Such a showing requires a precise description of how an alternative will improve the status quo by addressing a specific problem. *Id.* at 3:13-14. Proponents of an alternative bear the burden of making this showing. *Id.* at 3:14-15.

On September 18, 2020, Blockchains, LLC filed a letter, indicating a willingness to conduct a presentation on the basics of blockchain. The Commission issued PO 3 on October 29, 2020, and scheduled a Workshop for November 13, 2020.

II. STAFF'S RESPONSES TO PO 3

PO 3 requested: (1) a description and status of the Pilot, (2) a summary of the blockchain solutions contemplated in the Pilot, (3) updates on the Pilot's intended goals, objectives, and anticipated costs, and (4) a timeline for the completion of the Pilot. Staff does not have information responsive to these topics. Upon information and belief, NVE and Blockchains, LLC possess this information. As such, Staff anticipates that NVE and Blockchains, LLC will provide this information in their Comments, which Staff looks forward to reviewing.

III. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

Staff appreciates the opportunity to respond to PO 3, and looks forward to learning about NVE and Blockchains, LLC's proof of concept and other alternative solutions to track and certify PECs.
