STIPULATION

Pursuant to Nevada Administrative Code ("NAC") 703.750 and 703.845, Nevada Power Company d/b/a/ NV Energy ("Nevada Power") and Sierra Pacific Power Company d/b/a NV Energy ("Sierra" and, together with Nevada Power, the "Companies" or "NV Energy"); the Regulatory Operations Staff ("Staff") of the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada ("Commission"); the Office of the Attorney General's Bureau of Consumer Protection ("BCP"); Western Resource Advocates, Southwest Energy Efficiency Project, and Sierra Club (collectively, "Conservation Advocates"); and Google LLC ("Google"); each individually a "Signatory" and together the "Signatories", enter into this Stipulation to resolve all the issues in Docket Nos. 22-07002, 22-07003, and 22-07004.

SUMMARY OF STIPULATION

The Signatories agree that this Stipulation provides a reasonable resolution of the issues raised in these proceedings and that the Stipulation is in the public interest. The Stipulation only seeks relief that the Commission is empowered to grant. Accordingly, the Signatories recommend that the Commission accept the Stipulation and grant certain requests for relief made by the Companies in the (1) Joint Application for approval of the Second Amendment to the 2021 Joint Integrated Resource Plan, (2) Joint Application for approval of their 2022 Combined Annual Electric Demand Side Management Update Report as it relates to the Action Plan of their 2022-2041 Joint Integrated Resource Plan, and (3) in Sierra's Application for approval of its 2022 Natural Gas Conservation and Energy Efficiency Plan Annual Report, as modified by the Stipulation.

RECITALS

- 1. On July 1, 2022, Sierra filed its Application for approval of its 2022 Natural Gas Conservation and Energy Efficiency Plan Annual Report ("2022 C&EE Report"). The Commission designated the proceeding as Docket No. 22-07002.
- 2. Sierra's Application was filed in accordance with the Nevada Administrative Code ("NAC") Chapter 703 regulations governing pleadings (NAC 703.530 et seq.), and the NAC Chapter 704 regulations governing natural gas conservation and energy efficiency plans and reports contained in NAC 704.9702 through NAC 704.9718, inclusive, and in particular NAC 704.9712.
- 3. On July 1, 2022, the Companies filed with the Commission their Joint Application for approval of the Second Amendment to the 2021 Joint Integrated Resource Plan ("Second IRP Amendment"). The Commission designated the proceeding as Docket No. 22-07003.

- 4. The Joint Second IRP Amendment Application was filed pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS") and the NAC Chapters 704, including, but not limited to, NRS 704.741 et seq. and NAC 704.9005 et seq.
- 5. On July 1, 2022, the Companies filed with the Commission their Joint Application for approval of their 2022 Combined Annual Demand Side Management Update Report ("2022 DSM Update Report"). The Commission designated the proceeding as Docket No. 22-07004.
- 6. The 2022 DSM Update Report Joint Application was filed pursuant to NAC 704.934(8) and 703.535.
- 7. Pursuant to NRS § 703.301, Staff participates as a matter of right in all three Dockets.
- 8. On July 12, 2022, BCP filed Notices of Intent to Intervene pursuant to Chapter 228 of the NRS in Docket Nos. 22-07003 and 22-07004.
- 9. On July 18, 2022, the Commission issued Notices of Application and Notices of Prehearing Conference in Docket Nos. 22-07002 and 22-07003.
- 10. On July 19, 2022, the Commission issued Notice of Application and Notice of Prehearing Conference in Docket No. 22-07004.
- 11. On August 2, 2022, BCP filed a Notice of Intent to Intervene pursuant to Chapter 228 of the NRS in Docket No. 22-07002 and participates as a matter of right in that docket as well as Docket Nos. 22-07003 and 22-07004.
- 12. On August 3, 2022, the Companies submitted an errata to the 2022 DSM Update Report.
- 13. On August 4, 2022, Google filed petitions for leave to intervene ("PLTI") in Docket Nos. 22-07003 and 22-07004.
- 14. On August 10, 2022, Conservation Advocates filed PLTIs in Docket Nos. 22-07003 and 22-07004.

15.	On August 18, 2022, the Commission held prehearing conferences in Docker
Nos. 22-0700	2, 22-07003, and 22-07004.

- 16. On August 29, 2022, the Commission issued a Procedural Order consolidating the three Dockets and adopting a procedural schedule. The Commission also issued an Order granting the PLTIs filed.
- 17. On September 6, 2022, the Commission issued Procedural Order No. 2 extending the 135-day deadline imposed by NAC 704.9712 on Sierra's Application in Docket No. 22-07002 to align with the 165-day timeframe to adjudicate the Second IRP Amendment Joint Application.
- 18. On September 26, 2022, the Companies submitted reclassified workpaper files in Docket No. 22-07004 and supplemental workpapers in Docket No. 22-07002.
- 19. The Signatories have conducted their analysis of the Companies' Joint Applications in Docket Nos. 22-07003 and 22-07004 and Sierra's Application in Docket No. 22-07002 and agree to enter into the Stipulation.
- 20. By this Stipulation, the Signatories seek to resolve all issues pertaining to the three Dockets.

NOW THEREFORE, in light of the foregoing considerations, the Signatories agree and recommend the following:

AGREEMENT

In light of the foregoing recitals, the Signatories agree and recommend the following:

- 1. Granting Sierra's Application in Docket No. 22-07002, as modified by this Stipulation.
- 2. Granting the Joint Applications in Docket Nos. 22-07003 and 22-07004, as modified by this Stipulation.
- 3. Approval of the DSM and C&EE budgets and target savings as stated in **Attachment 1** to the Stipulation.

- 4. Approval of the Companies' agreement to withdraw their proposal in Docket No. 22-07003 to add the FlexPay program to the DSM portfolio, with the FlexPay program proposed budget reallocated among the following programs within both service territories:
 - a. Program Development for purposes of researching new innovative technologies and solutions that will increase opportunities and offerings for lower-income participants;
 - b. Residential Equipment and Plug Loads;
 - Residential Codes and New Construction.

Attachment 1 to the Stipulation demonstrates summarized budgets and savings of the revised DSM portfolio reflecting the removal of the FlexPay program. The Companies' research of new and innovative technologies to serve low-income customers shall be done in consultation as a part of a Program Development working group, within the DSM Collaborative.

- 5. Reinstatement of the Online Energy Assessment program for the remaining 2023 and 2024 DSM plan years. The Companies will work with its third-party measurement and verification contractor to garner better knowledge of how a participant's interaction with the disaggregation assessment software tool leads to energy savings.
- 6. Allocation of the budget spent on the energy disaggregation software tool, which is used by several DSM programs, among the In-Home Energy Assessment, Home Energy Reports, and Online Energy Assessment programs, including an allocation for the Natural Gas Conservation programs.
- 7. Modification of the energy storage measures proposed as part of the Companies' Demand Response programs into trial measures for testing the efficacy of energy storage as resources for demand response. NV Energy will include the Demand Response Storage trial measures within the Residential and Commercial Demand Response programs budgets, with measure budgets at \$57,000 for Nevada Power and \$23,000 for Sierra. These measures will have separate line items on the input sheets for inclusion in the benefits/costs tests as well as go through the measurement and verification process for evaluation.

- 8. Insertion into the Low Income program appliance replacement participation agreement of the language that (1) prohibits landlords or property management companies increasing rent after receiving low-income appliance replacements and (2) ensures that all appliances installed through the Low Income program are ENERGY STAR certified.
- 9. Approval of the Signatories' agreement on the following 2023 DSM Collaborative goals:
 - a. Create a Program Development Working Group for the purpose of guiding research in new innovative technologies and solutions that will increase opportunities and offerings with an emphasis on low-income participants;
 - b. Create a DSM Savings Goal Working Group for the purpose of assisting the Companies with providing recommendations to the Commission regarding both the goals and the metrics by which to set goals for the 2025-2027 DSM Plan for demand and energy savings and potentially other metrics as well as barriers to planning for and implementing energy efficiency and demand response programs and how to mitigate those barriers;
 - c. Continue discussions on topics including incentive levels, program updates and improvements, and availability of federal funding for DSM programs.
- 10. Establishing the new Ace Guru software model as the new default model used in evaluating the cost effectiveness of DSM Programs, with the understanding that continuous improvements will be made to ACE Guru with feedback from the DSM Collaborative, and retirement of the current *Portfolio Pro* software model.
- 11. Approval of using the definitions of "low-income" and "historically underserved communities," as defined in Nevada Senate Bill No. 448, beginning with the 2023 Program Year in the DSM portfolio.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 12. This Stipulation represents a compromise. Except as specifically indicated, neither the Stipulation nor the Commission's acceptance of the Stipulation shall have any precedential effect in future proceedings.
- 13. This Stipulation represents a negotiated settlement. No provision of the Stipulation is severable. If the Commission does not accept the Stipulation in whole, then the Stipulation shall be withdrawn, without prejudice to any claims or contentions that may have been made or are made in this Docket; no part of the Stipulation shall be admissible in evidence; and no Signatory shall be bound by any of the provisions of the withdrawn Stipulation.
- 14. In accordance with NAC 703.845, this Stipulation settles only issues relating to the present proceedings and seeks relief that the Commission is empowered to grant.
- 15. This Stipulation may be executed in one or more counterparts, all of which together shall constitute the original executed document. This Stipulation may be executed by the Signatories by electronic transmission, which signatures shall be as binding and effective as original signatures.
